The Canadian Mental Health Association - Calgary Region provides community-based mental health support, advocacy and awareness with programs that reach more than 18,000 individuals, youth, families and organizations each year. Our mission is to be a leader in reducing the impact of mental disorders and in promoting mental health and wellness through community-based services. Our vision is mentally healthy people in a healthy society. One of our mandates is to reduce the stigma surrounding mental disorders and we do that through awareness campaigns, events such as Fish & Chips and valued partnerships.

Horizon Housing Society brings hope to those in need by providing affordable, appropriate, integrated and supported housing to more than 700 individuals in our community each year. Since 1976, Horizon Housing Society has been providing appropriate housing for people in need. Our properties range from individual group homes to multi-family apartment properties. We span a variety of locations throughout the city and promote a mixed-use concept for our residences. We serve tenants with a variety of special needs including mental illness, physical disability, families and seniors living below the poverty line and the working poor. This type of housing helps reduce the stigma attached to a particular group and promotes community integration, independent living and acceptance while enhancing the quality of life for our tenants.

Both organizations are proud to work together to present the 7th Annual Fish & Chips Golf Tournament and Fly-Fishing Derby. The fundraising goal for this event is \$205,000. An estimated 67 per cent of the proceeds will help fund Horizon Housing Society's next affordable housing initiative for those in need and will support CMHA - Calgary Region's community-based programs for individuals and families impacted by mental disorders.

How are sponsorship investments used?

Building Independence (\$7,500): Horizon Housing Society and CMHA - Calgary Region help Calgarians living with mental disorders gain independence. CMHA provides emotional support and helps to develop living skills like budgeting, cooking, and self care, as well as coping skills to better manage their condition in their homes. Horizon Housing Society provides these appropriate living spaces that are affordable, accessible and safe. Proceeds from Fish & Chips go directly to programs and housing to help Calgarians build their independence.

Building Community (\$5,500): CMHA - Calgary Region and Horizon Housing Society strive to create healthy communities for all Calgarians. We are committed to the vision that all persons with special needs are living in appropriate homes integrated within our community. A portion of the funds raised goes directly toward building new affordable housing facilities for those living independently and supported in the community.

Building Support (\$3,500): One-in-five Calgarians will experience a mental disorder in their lifetime. Horizon Housing Society provides residential rental housing that is appropriate, affordable, integrated and supported. CMHA - Calgary Region's programs support those living with mental disorders, as well as their families. Funds raised from Fish & Chips will be directed toward CMHA - Calgary Region's individual and family programs and Horizon's next affordable housing initiative to provide homes to individuals living with a special need.

Building Awareness (\$2,500): Part of CMHA - Calgary Region's mission is to promote mental health and wellness through community-based education and services. Building awareness and reducing stigma surrounding mental illness is an important part of what CMHA does. Through community integration and by serving tenants with a variety of special needs, Horizon Housing Society is helping to reduce the stigma attached to a particular group and promote community integration. Without events like Fish & Chips, education and awareness campaigns funded by CHMA and affordable housing funded by Horizon Housing Society would not exist.
